Speaking of clean-up! Fall is clean-up time before winter and "pride in our neighborhood" is so important not only for home valuation but yourself and for your neighbors. There are way to many homes that: have yards in disrepair; deck missing from there home for 2 years (city code & covenant violation); dead trees (city & covenant violation) with 2-3 on one lot alone: fence sections that are down (covenant); grass being mowed into the street and not cleaned-up (covenant & city); yard waste being dumped into empty lots (even if lot owned by homeowner across the street), this is also a city and covenant violation; large above ground pools are a covenant violation but if they are emptied into your yard and thus your neighbors yards they are a city, covenant & federal EPA violation. These pools have not been set up with plumbing system to the sewer system as they were suppose to be by city code to drain. According to city it is also violation to pump to the storm drain system.
